<p>1. He Whare Māori: <i>E ai ki ngā kaiako:</i> Short term:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Permanent change to 56 until Wharenuī - Reconnect sink - Get an urn <p>Long term:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Expand on 56 using the space behind the class on Table Mountain to build a wharenuī, department facilities needed (office, extra teaching space), other facilities required by whanau. - Mahau for entrances (bottom of stairs of table mountain, from carpark or access from road) this helps indicate and establish Māori presence in the school. 	<p>For the welfare of our Rangatahi the whanau request a temporary move to Room 56 with the sink reconnected and an urn installed. This is a low cost and easy move as the timetable is still in development so classes and teachers using 56 can be relocated next year without disruption to current classes, the location promotes strong links with both Languages for Te Reo Māori and Social sciences for Poutama and Te Ao Maori. It will begin the process of making Te Ao Maori more visible and more connected with other Las.</p> <p>Whanau wish to engage in the new 5 year property plan beginning in 2011 for a suitable whare to whakamana te Ao Māori in the school and the community. Is there Maori representation on groups discussing property issues?</p> <p>Room 50 needs to be assessed and quotes need to be sought for repair. Whanau do not request to move back to 50 but have suggested it could be a good Health room being close to the gym or the school could find it useful in other ways. Maori has been timetabled here for at least ten years and in that time very little maintenance and improvement has gone in to this room. It is time for repairs and another subject to use this as a teaching space. Time for focus on appropriate Maori teaching space for rangatahi.</p>
